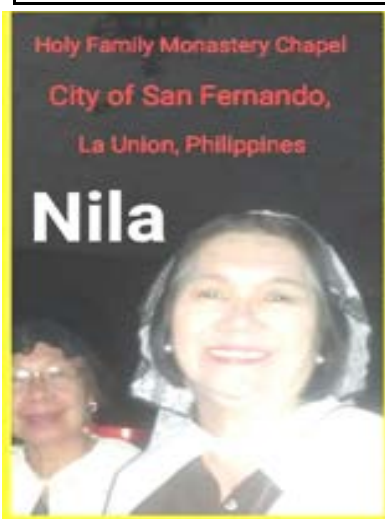


7.1 In the Footsteps of La Madre

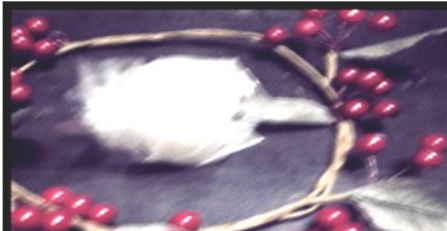

reached the Philippine archipelago on March 16, 1521. The Santo Nino de Cebu, is Magellan's gift to the first Filipino Catholics. We remember with thanksgiving the Spanish missionaries who brought Christianity to us Filipinos. During our Jubilee Year 2000 pilgrimage, Fr. Pete our pilgrimage chaplain in his homily posed these problem: How come the churches in Europe have become just places to see? Where have all the Christians gone? He challenged us to let not our churches be museums for the future. Let us in Asia share the faith we have received from Spain in the first place, be revealed back to Europe. Indeed the year 2021 will be a year of great jubilee for the Church in the Philippines. The four films in our report "Following the Footsteps of La Madre" is a sign that being Roman Catholics and Secular Carmelites, we take our faith seriously. In our St. Teresa of Avila Community, Carmela Palaroan, our director of formation died on May 15 , 2019 at age 76. She was buried on May 20. The members of our Community attended her funeral mass and burial at the cemetery. Beatriz Casanova, our member is shown holding flowers as an offering to Carmela Palaroan. Never did we know that she will die the following day, May 21. Betty at age 72 will also leave us to join our Creator. "One day, we will all depart on a journey free of cost. Who is St. Teresa? Teresa was born on March 28, 1515 in Avila, Spain. St. Teresa was a well-loved contemplative saint, mystic, writer, reformer, and theologian. She founded the Discalced Carmelites, and together with St. John of the Cross, the Discalced Carmelite Friars. Like many saints, Teresa was an ordinary woman who rose to greatness. Teresa felt that the best evidence that her delights came from God was that the experiences gave her peace, inspiration, and encouragement. The 50 golden years since the establishment in 1970 of the Roman Catholic Diocese of La Union, as it is in the 500 years of Catholicity in the Philippines, is a testament of the love and mercy of God to the Filipino faithful. This golden jubilee celebration and 500 year anniversary remind us to build ourselves upon our holy faith. This thought motivates our actions, not only within the boundaries of the diocese of La Union or of the Church, but the teachings, values of Christ (and of the Church) ought to permeate in our lives. As the beloved people of God, we mould our lives upon the teachings of the Faith. As Catholics, we believe that the Church is Christ, and we are members of that Mystical Body, united with each other, united with Him, and one with Him. The presence of the Holy Church counsels us of the state of grace and mercy wherein we enjoy the love of God, and by participating in His grace and mercy, we keep ourselves in His Love. On Easter Sunday in March 1521, Magellan's missionaries conducted the first mass on Philippine soil.

On April 24, 1521, together with some 800 Cebuans, Queen Humamai received the sacrament of baptism from the hands of Fr. Pedro Valderrama, Chaplain of Magellan's expedition. The name Juana was given to her as her Christian name in memory of Queen Juana of Castille, mother of King Carlos V. And King Humabon was christened Carlos in memory of Spanish King Carlos V., father of King Philip II. The Catholic Church in the Philippines directly links to an image of the Holy Child, called the Santo Niño. It was given as a baptismal gift. From politics to education to fiestas, Catholicism pervades much of Philippine society. Filipinos consider religion to be "very important" in their lives. The world recognizes the resilience of the Filipino spirit. That is the kind of faith that holds the Filipino from sliding down into deep despair that destroys the soul. The country is no stranger to natural disasters like typhoons, earthquakes, mudslides, tsunamis and floods, but it has not affected the religiosity of Filipino Catholics. Resilience grounded on Faith. Pope Francis had a brief meeting on January 17, 2015 with families of survivors of Typhoon Haiyan at the Palo Cathedral and blessed a mass grave of those who had died during the typhoon. The pope was inspired by his experience in the country, tweeted that "the Philippines is witness to the youth and vitality of the Church." We, members of the St. Teresa of Avila Community La Union were inspired to extend our vocation in Tacloban in December 2013 after it was hit by the super typhoon Yolanda. 50 symbolic Christmas packages were brought for the surviving kin in time for the day of remembrance and prayer.

The January 12, 2020 Taal Volcano eruption is the latest disaster that hit the Philippines. For starters, many people depend on volcanoes for their survival. Soil near active volcanoes gives really fertile soils, which are great for farming and crops. The geothermal energy of a volcano can power technological systems for nearby communities. Soaking in a hot spring provide health benefits. Lots of people visit volcanoes each year, so jobs often pop up nearby in hotels, restaurants, gift shops, and as tour guides. When our father, the late Evaristo Ortega became a lawyer, he got assigned to Albay in 1957 as Commissioner of the Court of Agrarian Relations (CAR). The late Emily Ortega, our eldest sister has a beautiful picture with the majestic Mayon Volcano in the background. I and husband Chicoy were wed on April 26, 1980 and had our honeymoon at Albay. Dado, a neighbor and friend of Chicoy migrated to Albay, where his wife Poi Alacar resides. They brought us around the place. The Tiwi Hot Springs are believed to have medicinal properties. On February 1, 1814, the greatest tragedy happened in Cagsawa and it was the eruption of Mayon Volcano. Situated in Albay, Cagsawa Ruins is a historical landmark that serves as the centerpiece of the Cagsawa Ruins Park where tourists can enjoy the scenic view of Mayon Volcano. Our Bolong family had a picture with the Cagsawa Ruins as background. Taal Volcano is the second most active volcano in the Philippines. Viewed from the Tagaytay Ridge in Cavite, Taal Volcano and Lake presents one of the most picturesque and attractive views in the Philippines. Fresh air, grasslands and calm waters amongst other things would readily welcome tourists upon stepping on the volcano island. Our Bolong Family joined the Cavite Tour Caravan upon invitation of sister Flor Ocampo, her last project before resigning at the Department of Tourism. Mount Pinatubo, an active volcano is located in the central portion of Zambales Mt. Range in Luzon Island, Philippines. The world's largest eruption happen in the past 100 years was the June 15, 1991 eruption of Mount Pinatubo. Its eruption was complicated by the arrival of Typhoon Yunya, bringing a mix of ash and water. These volcanic ashes eventually were utilized in making products like religious articles. During our Marian Pilgrimage 2002, we brought along 6 God the Father statuettes made of Pinatubo ash and gave it away to the following: Nuns at the Our Lady of All Nations, Amsterdam; Nuns at the Shrine of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal, France; Sor Isabel and Sor Saray, Hermanas Clarisas of Lerma, seated behind us at the Most Holy Christ Chapel, Burgos; Hermanas Clarisas of Lerma, seated behind us at the Most Holy Christ Chapel, Burgos; Mother superior Celine and the late Sr. Lucia at the Chapel of Carmel Coimbra, Portugal. 7.3. COVID-19 A Call to Live Differently

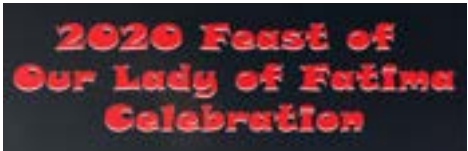

I was inspired to do a video here at Barangay Pagdaraosan at a mountain dubbed Bantay ni Ama Ken Maria, where statues of God the Father and Madre Santissima De La Luz were erected in 1999 and 2002 respectively. While Nila was at Vigan home starting her day with mass using her cellphone and receiving spiritual communion I am fortunate attending mass alone at the Carmel of the Holy Family Monastery Chapel that is empty and receiving sacramental Holy Communion from SVD priests. Solemnity of the Annunciation Lent's austerity is interrupted as we solemnly keep a feast in honor of the Annunciation of Our Lady, or the Annunciation of the Lord today, March 25, 2020. One day Angel Gabriel appeared to Mary and said, "Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you." When Mary heard this, she was disturbed. The angel said to Mary: "Do not be afraid, You have won God's favour. You are to conceive and bear a son and you must name Him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High". Mary surrendered herself to God's will saying: "Behold the handmaid of the Lord. Be it done unto me according to Thy word." Angelus. We pray daily in the morning, noon and evening. In this prayer, we recall the happy news which God gave to humanity. Trusting in God Nila listened to a rerun of Life is Worth Living by American Archbishop Fulton Sheen. Noting the relevance of the topic Trust in God's Plan she wrote down what Ven. Sheen has to say on trusting God's Plan. "There was a man in the land of Uz. His name was Job. The man was simple and upright, fearing God and avoiding evil. As the story unfolded, Job was gradually divested of all the things he has—home, family, cattle, great wealth and health. Job lost everything but his wife and his life. He went from rich to poor in just a few hours. Job did not get angry with God, "With nothing I came into the world and with nothing I shall leave it. The Lord has taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord." Then a man named Elihu said: "Maybe God isn't angry with Job. Maybe there is another lesson to be learned. Job should not be too hasty to think God left him." Job did not need to know why things happened; he just needed to keep trusting God and God's love for him. God then gave Job his health, double the wealth, and a long happy life. The lesson is to always trust God. "If you love your life, you will lose it. If you give it up in this world, you will be given eternal life" (Jn. 12:25). Luz is bent on her shooting to bring to the world that we should not lose our trust in God. God has not failed us.

My twin, Ma. Luz took a picture for posterity on March 19, 2020, Feast of St. Joseph at the Carmel of the Holy Family Monastery Chapel, San Fernando City, La Union. Seven daily mass goers attended mass in spite of the coronavirus lockdown. It is understandable for it is the feastday of St. Joseph. She wants the picture to show that she had experienced this lockdown due to coronavirus in our lifetime. She wants this episode to have a space in our faith journal. It is by the grace of God that she managed in spite of the lockdown in Luzon to hear mass and receive Holy Communion daily at the Carmel of the Holy Family and SVD at San Fernando. Like the early Christians who hear mass in hiding, she wants our grandchildren and great grandchildren to appreciate our deep faith and a way to show that the faith handed by the Spanish missionaries 500 years ago in 1521 is not in vain. The following day, a Carmelite nun commented "Because you took picture" insinuating that they have renewed restrictions for public mass goers. That picture is not something found in ordinary place and time but in extraordinary times. I am reminded of a story Archbishop John Foley (later named Cardinal) told us when we twins met him during our visit to the Pontifical Council for Social Communication at the Vatican). This story illustrates how Archbishop Foley balanced his clerical and journalistic identities. During a trip to Egypt in 1975, Cardinal Krol asked him whether he should take a camel ride. A cautious Father Foley said no, but the thrill of riding was so strong that Cardinal Krol ignored the advice. As his eminence, wearing an Arab head scarf, struggled not to fall off the camel, Father Foley snapped a picture. When the photo appeared in newspapers, Cardinal Krol asked him why he had taken the photo after telling him not to ride the beast. "As your priest, I gave you my best advice," he replied. "As a journalist, I took your picture." In the same token being Communication Arts graduates from the Pontifical University of Santo Tomas in 1974 and recipients of a Pastoral Communication Course in 2004 at the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome, we can't miss doing a mini documentary in celebration of today's Feast of Annunciation. The three lessons we learn today are: to be prepared to be used by God; 2) put your faith in God; 3) live your life as a servant of the Lord.

Covid-19 shall truly pass one day. This is our prayer, as the coronavirus pandemic forces the closure of workplaces, schools and retail and entertainment places. We twins were at the Vatican Radio in 2004 and had a picture with the Castel Sant' Angelo as background. In 590 Pope Gregory the Great, conducting a penitential procession to pray for the end of a plague, had a vision of the archangel Michael sheathing his sword over the castle, signifying the end of the plague. What Malacañang calls an 'enhanced community quarantine' (ECQ) took effect midnight of Tuesday, March 17, 2020 until April 14. ECQ is a total lockdown, restricting the movement of the population except for necessity, work, and health circumstances; & temporary closure of non-essential shops and businesses. I, Ma. Luz stays at OCDS House of Prayer, City of San Fdo, L U. going to mass daily and receives Sacramental Holy Comm. The ECQ was originally set to last until April 12, but Pres Rodrigo Duterte accepted the recommendation of the Inter-Agency Task Force on Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF-EID) to extend it until April 30. On the other hand, I Ma. Nila who stays at the province of Ilocos Sur hears mass on social media daily and receives Spiritual Holy Communion. With the lifting of ECQ a General Communication Quarantine (GCQ) took effect which is considered the 'new normal,' until such time that a vaccine for the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) becomes available. Children aged 0-20 & elderly aged 60 & above are still urged to stay home. However Trade Sec. Ramon Lopez said that seniors who are working as employees, exec. or bus. owners will be allowed to go to work during the GCQ. This gave me the confidence to ask for a permit to travel up to Tagudin. With the permit granted, I informed twin Luz who came to pick me up at Tagudin. If what you do is for God's glory, do not be afraid. If you're having a hard time breathing behind your mask, maybe the face mask hat could be the solution. We're happy to use the stylish mask given by sister Flor.

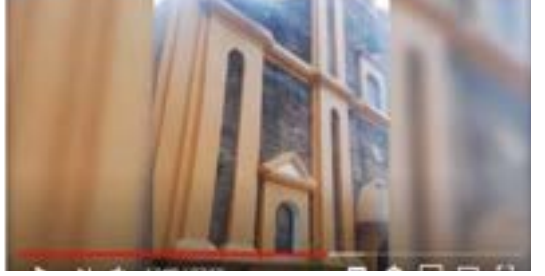

There is a tape, ‘How To Be Happy Anyhow’ that ‘everybody has trials and tribulations, but its how you handle them that makes the difference. English poets Lord Byron and Walter Scott were both cripples. Byron was very bitter about his lameness, always moody and self-conscious in public. Scott on the other hand, had never been heard to complain or speak one bitter word about his handicap, not even to his dearest friend. It is not surprising then that Scott once received a letter from Byron to which he said, “ Ah Scott, I will give all my fame to have your happiness.” Scottish author Sir Walter Scott had UNFALTERING FAITH just like Job. The Lord gave and the Lord has taken away; may the name of the Lord be praised.” (Job chapter 1 Verse 21). Scott faced financial disaster when his publisher went bankrupt in 1826. He was heavily invested in the firm, and it appeared that he would lose everything, including Abbotsford, his castle-like home. A Christian of unwavering faith, he wrote in his journal, "Things are so much worse than I apprehended that I shall neither save Abbotsford nor anything else. Naked we entered the world and naked we leave it. Blessed be the name of the Lord.”

One could feel the presence of La Madre in the November OCDS East Asia Congress at Tagaytay for the twins brought her statue and they gifted the foreign delegates with her statuettes. Maria Luz driving the carriage with the statuette of St. Teresa stopped for a while at the OCDS House of Prayer where the life-size statue was during the procession in commemoration of the Feast of St. Teresa on October 15, 2008. The statuette after the mass was brought to the house of the Hermana Mayors starting from 2008 to 2015. The tin statuette of St. Teresa is fragile thus a need for a fiber glass pilgrim statuette. Seven cartons with 42 pilgrim fiber glass statuettes made by TML Holy Craft and 125 booklets were shipped to Spain on 2015, La Madre 5th Birth Centenary. Ma. Luz requested Milagros of Centro International Teresiano San Juanista (CITeS) to distribute the statuettes and the booklets entitled "A Child's Genuine Voice in Prayer and Action" to the nun monasteries. We joyfully read the acknowledgement letters sent through email by some of the nun monasteries who received the statuettes. St. Teresa of Avila's 15-inch pilgrim statuettes is symbolic - 15 to mark the year of her birth, 1515; and the pentahedron or five-sided base symbolizes her 5th birth centenary. The St. Teresa of Avila Community yearly celebrates two occasions: her Birth Anniversary on March 28 were in an OCDS member brings home the fiberglass statuette of St. Teresa. On October 15, her death anniversary where her statuette in a pentahedron enclosure is brought out in procession before mass. We successfully fulfilled our mission of leaving seven fiber glass statuettes of St. Teresa in the seven continents of the world during our 84 days around the world journey in 2017. The statuettes manifests our intimate union with God through the teachings and spirituality of Teresa of Avila (1515-1582). The Tertiary was formed by Bishop Victorino C. Ligot, D.D., the first bishop of the diocese on August 14, 1975, with the able guidance and inspiration of the Carmelite nuns at Pindangan Ruins led by Mother Nieves, Mother Mary, Sr. Elizabeth and Sr. Stella. The love of the pioneer Tertiary members to Carmel had passed on to the present OCDS members. The St. Teresa of Avila Community (La Union) met with Bishop Daniel O. Presto, D.D. on its 43rd foundation anniversary on August 14, 2018.

On February 3, 2020 I instructed the work to be done at the OCDS House of Prayer (HOP). The sketch done by artist Tony Belleza shows what happened as narrated by Rose. “The carpenters put thick slab of brick to maintain the balance of the carosa before leaving the OCDS HOP. Unknowingly, the artist took the slab in his hands and when he stepped to put it down, the carosa tumbled backwards - the wheel of the bicycle went up in the air and the two candle holders on front were thrown down on the ground and broke right away. The pentagon’s roof opened throwing St. Teresa’s statuette on the ground breaking the halo. I was at that time having my rosary walk and I was heading where the carosa was. I ran but it was so fast—I was aghast.” Listening to what happened, we twins felt shock; acceptance and thankfulness enveloped us. The statuette’s face and body suffered no scratches or deformity and the two glass frames suffered no breakage. Certainly, the minor damage resulting from the accident is through divine intervention. St. Teresa of Avila says, “I know by experience that the glorious St. Joseph assists us generally in all necessities. In the morning of February 7, we twins wore our Filipiniana attire and proceeded to the Sea and Sky College for our hair and make-up by SASC instructor Jesus Managan and a student. I instructed the workers to fix the carriage and the SASC students to decorate it. Our shooting with the BA Communication students who acted as production assistants and camera man went as scheduled. 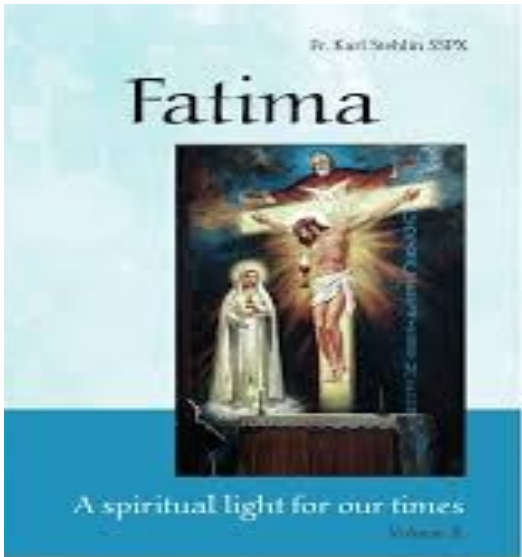

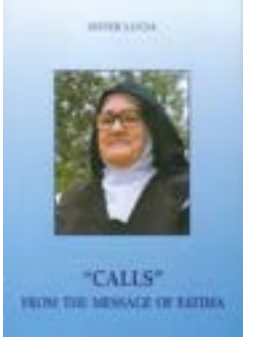

7.10 Devotions to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary

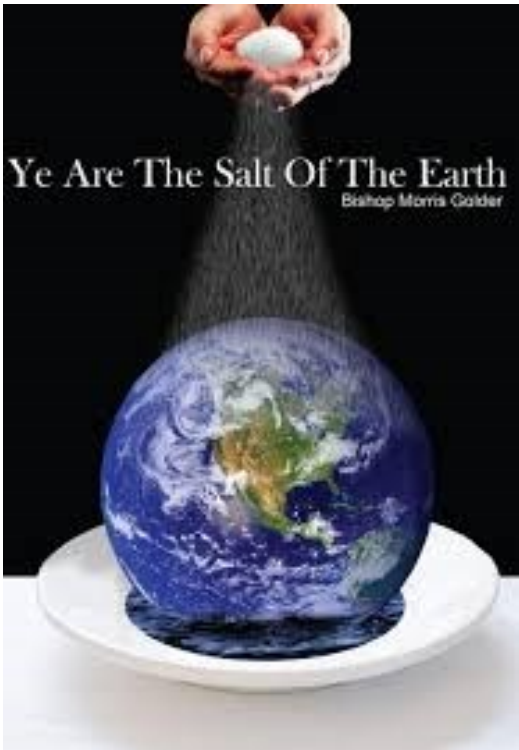

NILA: For year 2020, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus on June 19, Friday and the Feast of the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary the following day, June 20. In popular iconography, while the Sacred Heart of Jesus bears a crown of thorns, the Immaculate Heart of Mary is pierced by a sword, inspired by the prophesy of Simeon. I would like to share with you the article written by Ricardo Saluda entitled, "The twin hearts of Jesus and Mary." The Carmelite nun, now Servant of God, Sr. Lucia of Fatima said: "In Mary I find strength and consolation. This Immaculate Heart is the channel by which God makes the multitude of His graces pour into my soul." This devotion to Jesus through Mary wasn't just the fruit of Lucia's spiritual musings, or even the Blessed Virgin's instruction, but our Lord's own instruction. "Our Lord told me a few days ago," Lucia recounted, "I desire very ardently the propagation of the cult and the devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, because this Heart is the magnet that draws souls to me, ... the inexhaustible well causing the living water of My mercy to pour over all the earth." The Message of the Angel of Fatima First there are the words of the Angel of Peace in the spring of 1916 to the three children of Fatima: "The Hearts of Jesus and Mary are attentive to the voice of your supplications." Then he speaks again in the summer of 1916: "The Holy Hearts of Jesus and Mary have merciful designs for you." Then in the autumn of 1916, he dictates a prayer which in part says: "And I draw upon the infinite merits of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary that you might convert poor sinners." LUZ: Living our devotion to Mary In a book written by Fr. Karl Stehlin of the traditional religious order, Society of Saint Pius X, entitled "Fatima: A Spiritual Light for Our Time" Volume 2 he said that many would-be devotees may say that devotion to Mary is simple enough. We pray to Mary, and that opens the floodgates to Jesus' mercy. Not so fast. In fact, devotion to Mary demands far more than rote prayer, as Sister Lucia showed in her life and sacrifices. Fr. Stehlin cites elements of Sister Lucia's devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. First, it was her constant refuge in every moment and trial, as the vessel by which God's grace gushed into her. Lucia's undivided and unrelenting reliance on the Immaculate Heart reflects her total faith, hope and love for God, through Mary.

Sacrifice is another element of Lucia's devotion to the Immaculate Heart: she patiently bore every burden and pain, and offered all to Mary, especially her pains, difficulties, and frustrations in safeguarding and spreading the truths and messages of Fatima. In believing and propagating her visions, Lucia suffered disdain and estrangement not just from her community, but even from her own family. Her own mother thought she was losing her wits, and she eventually lived away from Fatima for decades. But with the Immaculate Heart as her companion and consolation, she entered the strict order of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, and never wavered in her witness to Fatima, declaring: "Even if they kill me, I cannot lie." Simplicity, humility and obedience. True and complete devotion to the Immaculate Heart means supplanting one's own heart with Mary's, so that every moment one would think, feel and act as she would. Lucia lived the simple life of a convent nun doing daily chores even as she scribbled her Fatima accounts and messages. In the face of arrogant detractors, discouraging her visions she never let her righteous pride prod her to unleash sharp rebukes but simply share her recollections in truth and love. Lucia remained a Carmelite nun living by the rule of her superiors. CONSECRATION TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS and to the IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY LUZ: Lord, as we consecrate ourselves, we ask your blessing on what we strive to become in your discipleship. Help our homes to become truly "domestic churches": • Temples of FAITH and worship, which prayer and the sacraments constantly renew; • Centers of HOPE and longing for what your promises hold before us. • Above all, make our homes radiant place of LOVE, founded on your own self-giving in the charity "poured out into our hearts," gracing them with the gifts of the communion: friendship, understanding and forgiveness, caring and healing, readiness and purity, patience, true joy, and the peace which, you said, is uniquely your gift and not the world's.

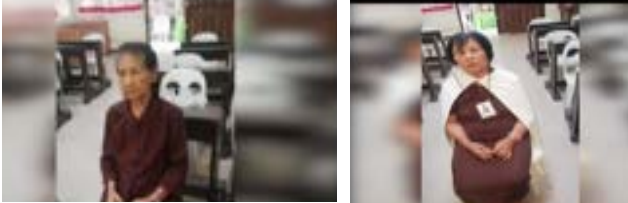

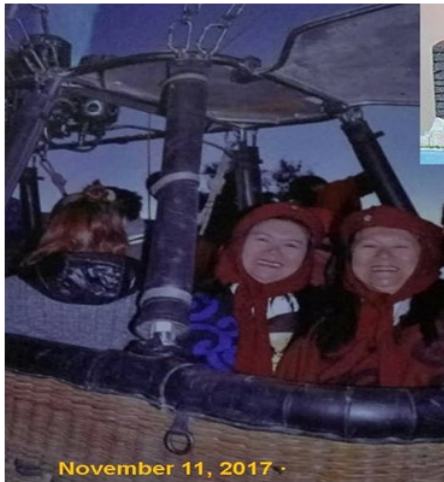

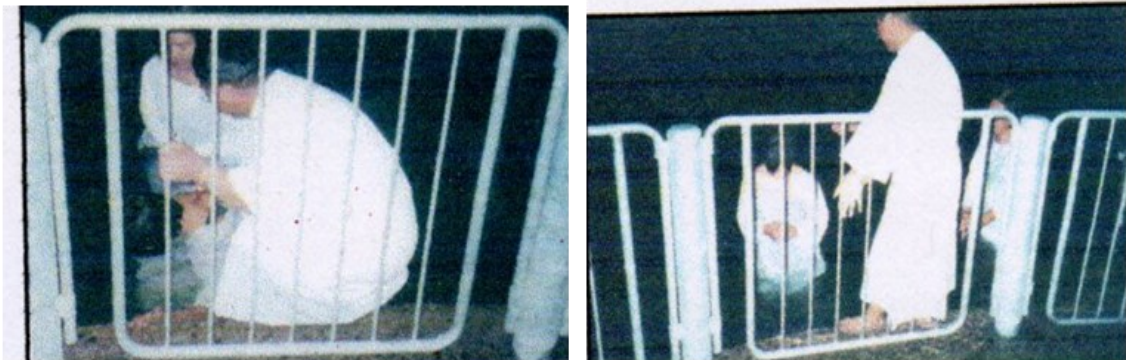
